WHY SHOULD I TAKE CLEP TESTS?

Colleges use your CLEP test scores to decide if they should give you college credit/placement for the class you took. Woodlawn is offering CLEP tests in select subjects to maximize opportunities for students to earn college credit for AP and other advanced classes. It is recommended that students take CLEP tests at the end of the term in which they complete the corresponding course(s).

COST: \$95 per test

LOCATION: Woodlawn High School

FALL REGISTRATION DEADLINE:

→ **November 15, 2020**

FALL TEST DATES: December 10-11, 2020

SPRING REGISTRATION DEADLINE:

→ **March 15, 2020**

SPRING TEST DATES: May 10-11, 2021

To take a CLEP Test, students are required to:

1. Sign up by the registration deadline &
2. Pay the CLEP exam fee prior to test date.

CLEP vs. AP EXAMS

CLEP EXAMS

- Offered Year-Round
- Computer-Based Test
- Multiple-Choice Questions
- *Essay for College Composition Test Only*
- 1.5 – 2 hours long
- Scores available immediately after the test is submitted online
- Colleges/universities determine credit given

AP EXAMS

- Offered Only in May
- Paper-Based Test
- Multiple Choice Questions & Free Response Questions for ALL Tests
- 2 – 3 hours long
- Scores released two months (July) after the test is completed
- Colleges/universities determine credit given
- Required for AP Scholar Recognitions
